PRINCIPAL REASON(S) OR PURPOSE FOR PROPOSING THIS RULE: [see §8057-A(1)(A)&(C)]

The Land Use Planning Commission is seeking public comment on proposed amendments to its Chapter 10, Land Use Districts and Standards. The primary objectives of this rulemaking are to update the standards regarding roads and water crossings to be more consistent with the Maine Department of Environmental Protection's standards in 06-096 CMR 305, Permit By Rule; to enhance public safety; and to provide for aquatic habitat connectivity in flowing waters. The proposed amendments also reorganize Section 10.27,D, Roads and Water Crossings, to improve readability.

ANALYSIS AND EXPECTED OPERATION OF THE RULE: [see §8057-A(1)(B)&(D)]

The proposed rule revisions will improve consistency of LUPC road and water crossings standards with DEP rules, as well as improve consistency with certain provisions of the existing Army Corps, General Permit for the State of Maine. References are included to clarify that the LUPC crossing standards do not apply to land management roads that are regulated by the Maine Forest Service, nor the replacement of existing culverts that are covered by a statutory exemption. The revisions also reorganize the standards to improve readability.
