Head Lice



Head lice do not spread disease in the United States but scratching can result in secondary infections.

If hair can be combed with a finetoothed comb, remove lice and eggs with thorough combing. Apply licekilling shampoo following labeled instructions. Discourage head-to-head contact. Do not exclude infested students from school
