Air Emission License
Amendment # 2**

FINDINGS OF FACT

After review of the air emission license amendment application, staff investigation reports, and other documents in the applicant's file in the Bureau of Air Quality, pursuant to 38 Maine Revised Statutes (M.R.S.) § 344 and § 590, the Maine Department of Environmental Protection (Department) finds the following facts:

I. REGISTRATION

A. Introduction

Eurovia Atlantic Coast LLC, d/b/a Northeast Paving (Eurovia), was issued Air Emission License A-978-71-C-R/A on 6/10/13, for the operation of emission sources associated with their portable hot mix asphalt plant and crushed stone and gravel facility. The license was subsequently amended on 10/24/14 (A-978-71-D-A).

Eurovia has requested a minor revision to remove Generator Cat C-15 from this license (to be added to Eurovia's Air Emission License A-590).

The equipment addressed in this license amendment is located at 2 Crushed Rock Rd, Charlotte, Maine.

B. Emission Equipment

The following equipment is removed in this air emission license amendment:

C. Application Classification

All rules, regulations, or statutes referenced in this air emission license refer to the amended version in effect as of the date this license was issued.

This amendment will not increase licensed emissions of any pollutant. Therefore, this amendment is determined to be a minor revision and has been processed as such.

D. Facility Classification

With the annual fuel limit on the generators, and the asphalt plant and associated heater, the facility is licensed as follows:

- As a synthetic minor source of air emissions, because Eurovia is subject to license restrictions that keep facility emissions below major source thresholds for criteria pollutants; and
- As an area source of hazardous air pollutants (HAP), because the licensed emissions are below the major source thresholds for HAP.

II. BEST PRACTICAL TREATMENT (BPT)

A. Introduction

In order to receive a license, the applicant must control emissions from each unit to a level considered by the Department to represent Best Practical Treatment (BPT), as defined in 06-096 C.M.R. ch. 100. Separate control requirement categories exist for new and existing equipment.

BPT for existing emissions equipment means that method which controls or reduces emissions to the lowest possible level considering:

- the existing state of technology;
- the effectiveness of available alternatives for reducing emissions from the source being considered; and
- the economic feasibility for the type of establishment involved.

B. Annual Emissions

This license amendment will not change the facility's licensed annual emissions.

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Based on the above Findings and subject to conditions listed below, the Department concludes that the emissions from this source:

- will receive Best Practical Treatment,
- will not violate applicable emission standards, and
- will not violate applicable ambient air quality standards in conjunction with emissions from other sources.

The Department hereby grants Air Emission License Amendment A-978-71-F-M subject to the conditions found in Air Emission License A-978-71-C-R/A, in amendment A-978-71-D-A, and the following conditions.

Severability. The invalidity or unenforceability of any provision of this License Amendment or part thereof shall not affect the remainder of the provision or any other provisions. This License Amendment shall be construed and enforced in all respects as if such invalid or unenforceable provision or part thereof had been omitted.

SPECIFIC CONDITIONS

Condition (25) of Air Emission License A-978-71-D-A is hereby removed.
