

### Lead Poisoning is 100% Preventable!

Test your home for the presence of lead dust. To obtain a FREE lead dust test kit visit www.maine.gov/healthyhomes






### Lead Testing Wallet Card

Keep track of your child's and home's lead levels. Cut this card out to keep in your wallet. Use it to record your child's blood lead levels provided by your doctor. Also, record the levels of lead dust in your home. Remember to test your home every time you move. Be sure to ask what the lead levels mean and what you can do to protect your child from lead poisoning.
