


Case Information:



Characteristics:



 Highest rates among 65+ age group



 Signs and symptoms include extreme fatigue, aches, fever, chills, sweating, dark urine, and anemia



 12 People with babesiosis were co-infected with Lyme disease.



 4 People with babesiosis were co-infected with anaplasmosis.

Hospitalizations:



- · 23 (23%) patients were hospitalized
- 14% decrease from 2017

Demographics:




72% of patients were male

Prevention:

- Wear light-colored clothing, including longsleeved shirts, long pants, and socks
- · Use an EPA-approved repellant
- Avoid wooded and brushy areas with high grass and leaf litter
- Check your clothing and gear for ticks and do a full-body tick check when coming back indoors
