Malaria

Cases

55% of patients (5) were male

Average age (5-56 years)

66% of patients (2) were female Average age (23-54)



100% of patients travelled to Haiti



300% increase from 2017

There were no reported cases of Zika in 2018

Prevention:

- · Wear a long-sleeved shirt, long pants, and socks
- Treat clothing with permethrin or purchase pretreated clothing
- Apply lotion, liquid, or spray repellent to exposed skin
- Use prescribed anti-malarial medication

Reporting:

- · Malaria, Chikungunya, Zika, and Dengue fever must be reported to Maine CDC within 48 hours of recognition or strong suspicion
