# Pediarix Shortage

As many are already aware, Glaxo Smith Kline (GSK) will be instituting allocations of Pediarix until September 2013, as a result of the ongoing Pentacel vaccine shortage. With this, GSK has experienced increased demand for Pediarix vaccine. Unfortunately, they will not be able to supply this vaccine at the same rate over the next 4-6 months before Pentacel is available without restriction, which is currently anticipated to occur in September 2013. We are asking that providers only order half of the Pediarix quantity that have been ordered over the past several months. The Maine Immunization Program would like to take this opportunity to provide you with guidance on how to appropriately use the DTaP combination vaccines, during this shortage.

# Pediarix (DTaP-IPV-HepB)

- Pediarix contains the vaccine components DTaP, IPV, and Hepatitis B. The primary series is 3 doses (0.5 mL) given intramuscularly at 2, 4, and 6 months of age. It should not be given to infants younger than 6 weeks of age nor to children 7 years or older.
- Minimum intervals for Pediarix components:

Hepatitis B 2 to 3 = 8 weeks

DTaP 2 to 3 = 4 weeks

IPV 2 to 3 = 4 weeks

**Kinrix (DTap-IPV)** 

- Do not give Kinrix to children who are 2, 4, and 6 months old
- Kinrix is only licensed for children aged 4-6 years (Hint): Kin = Kindergarten!
- Recommendation:

Booster for fifth dose of DTaP and fourth dose of IPV.

- Cannot be used earlier than the kindergarten dose.
- BUT, if given in error at 15-18 months, can count as valid as long as minimum interval is met (DTaP #3 to #4 = 6 months, IPV #2 to #3 = 4 weeks).
- Using DTAP-IPV in a child younger than age 4 or for other doses in the DTaP or IPV series is not recommended.

# **Maine Immunization Program Updates:**

- The Annual Immunization Conference will be held on November 13, 2013 at the Augusta Civic center. This will be a joint conference with ID EPI, HIV-STD and Viral Hepatitis. There will be more information to come.
- Quarterly reports will now be given to providers on distributed and wasted vaccines.
