3. STRONGLY consider participating in the college's LIVE-IN FIREFIGHTER program. Live-in students stay for free at local fire/EMS stations (NO dorm fees!), receive free training (state and national certifications), and are paid for responding to emergencies. You may graduate with no student loan debt! Successful completion of a degree as a live-in will help put you at the top of the hiring list when you apply to a fire department. Most firefighter jobs provide a 25 year guaranteed-benefit retirement option.

These associate degree programs help students develop state of the art skills and knowledge for professional fire protection, and guide them to become career-ready.
