

#### **OVERVIEW OF THE COMMISSION**

<u>PURPOSE</u>: The Commission on Governmental Ethics and Election Practices is an independent commission established to guard against corruption or undue influencing of the election process and against acts or the appearance of misconduct by Legislators.

<u>DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES</u>: The general duties of the Commission are to investigate and make advisory recommendations to the appropriate body of the Legislature of any apparent violations of the ethical standards set by the Legislature; to issue advisory opinions and guidelines on problems or questions involving possible conflict of interest in matters under consideration by, or pertaining to, the Legislature; and to administer the sources of income disclosure law.

Additional responsibilities of the Commission are to administer and investigate any violations of the requirements for campaign reports and campaign financing, including the provisions of the Maine Clean Election Act and Fund; to conduct biennially, in conjunction with the Attorney General and the Chair of the Legislative Council, an ethics seminar for Legislators; to administer the lobbyist disclosure laws; to administer and ensure effective implementation of the Maine Clean Election Act and Fund according to Title 21-A, chapter 14; to provide for enhanced monitoring and enforcement of election practices; and to institute electronic submission of reports and computerized tracking of campaign, election and Jobbying information under the Commission's jurisdiction.

**ORGANIZATION:** The Commission on Governmental Ethics and Election Practices, established by Title 5, section 12004-G, subsection 33, consists of 5 members appointed by the Governor. Members of the public, groups and organizations may nominate qualified individuals to the Governor for appointment to the Commission during a nomination period jointly established by the Governor, the President of the Senate, the Senate Minority Leader, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the House Minority Leader. Appointments are subject to review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over legal affairs and confirmation by the Legislature.

No more than two members may be enrolled in the same political party. Each member serves a four-year term. A person may not be appointed to the Commission who is a member of the Legislature or who was a member of the previous legislature, or who was a declared candidate for an elective county, state or federal office within two years prior to the appointment, or who holds an elective county, state or federal office, or who is an officer of a political committee, party committee or political action committee.

Pursuant to 1 M.R.S.A. Section 1006, the Commission may call for the aid or assistance in the performance of its duties on the Attorney General, Secretary of State, Department of Audit, or any law enforcement agency in Maine.

<u>THE STAFF</u>: The staff of the Commission conducts the daily business of the Commission. The executive director serves as spokesperson and liaison between the Legislature and the Commission, conducts Commission correspondence, makes findings and recommendations, tracks legislation, prepares fiscal notes, conducts preliminary investigations, drafts legislation, and prepares and edits Commission publications.

The lobbyist registrar processes the registrations of lobbyists and political action committees (PAC), prepares lobbyist and PAC registers, compiles and prepares statistics, and advises lobbyists and others with regard to the provisions of the lobbyist and PAC laws.

The candidate registrar processes registrations and reports, assists candidates and others in completing reports, advises candidates as to their legal obligations, prepares agenda materials, monitors filings, audits reports, and prepares statistics.

The commission assistant provides administrative, electronic data processing, and clerical support to the Commission and its staff members.

Although the Commission is empowered to investigate violations of the laws on campaign financing and legislative ethics, it has no investigative staff. Thus, it relies largely on the Attorney General's Office for assistance in this area.

**RECORDS:** The staff devotes considerable time to receiving, organizing, and maintaining records for public inspection. The following records are made available for public review: campaign finance reports of county, state, and gubernatorial candidates and candidates for Federal office; party committee reports; and political action committee reports. Also on file are financial disclosure statements of federal officials and members of the Legislature, minutes of Commission meetings, and advisory opinions. The Commission also maintains lobbyist disclosure and reporting documents. Reports filed with the Commission may be copied for a modest fee.

**OFFICE LOCATION:** The Commission office, located in Room 114 of the State Office Building in Augusta, is scheduled to move to 242 State Street, Augusta, in June 1999. The new office will permit a more efficient use of space and provide an expanded area for reviewing public reports. The new location will also provide public computer terminals when the Commission offers filers the opportunity to file reports electronically. That option is expected to be available in 2000.

#### CAMPAIGN REPORTS AND FINANCES LAW

The campaign finance laws require candidates for state, county, gubernatorial, and federal office and political action committees organized within the State to register and report their campaign contributions and expenditures to the Commission. Out-of-state political action committees making contributions to Maine candidates are subject to the reporting laws as well.

#### **ACTIVITY DURING 1997-98**

<u>Registrations</u>: During the biennium ending December 31, 1998, the Commission Staff processed at total of 560 registrations for candidates seeking election to state, county, and congressional offices. A total of 8 candidates participated in the gubernatorial campaign, 75 candidates competed for election to fill 35 State Senate vacancies; 323 candidates registered for election to fill 151 State House of Representatives seats; 4 candidates sought election in the First District United States Congressional race; and 2 candidates competed for the Second District United States Congressional position.

Educational and Informational Activities: The election year was, as usual, a busy one for the Commission. Throughout the year, the staff communicated regularly with state and county candidates advising them of their legal obligations to register with the Commission and to file periodic reports of their campaign finances. In April, general reporting instructions were mailed, together with standardized forms, filing schedules, and other helpful information.

A substantial part of the Commission Staff's daily workload involves advising candidates and treasurers about how to complete reports and providing informal advice regarding the requirements of the law. Assistance is provided both in person and by phone. The Staff also routinely advised other individuals including legislative staff personnel, members of the general public, students, scholars, and reporters regarding a myriad of campaign finance reporting issues. To ensure the accuracy of the advice provided, Staff members conferred with the Commission or with the Attorney General on questions of law that are subject to interpretation and where no prior ruling existed. The Staff also actively assisted persons to inspect various reports filed with the Commission.

The Commission Staff collaborated again with the Secretary of State's Office to produce a candidate "guide" to understanding the reporting laws. The informational pamphlet detailed the requirements of Maine's election laws and "guided" the candidate through the entire reporting process. During the election year, over 600 copies of the pamphlet were distributed to candidates, treasurers, and others.

Another aspect of the Commission's information program involved the distribution of lists of political action committees, lobbyists, candidates, and treasurers.

**Enforcement Activity:** The monitoring of reports is a key element of the Commission's election year program. Although the staff lacks the resources to conduct in-depth compliance audits, it carefully reviews each registration and report for timeliness and accuracy. Following that review, each person who files a late report is notified of the violation and advised of his or her right to a hearing before the full Commission.

During the 1998 election cycle, the Commission and its staff considered the late filings of 55 candidates, 40 political action committees, 11 party committees, and 81 lobbyists. The disposition of those cases was as follows:

During the 1997-98 biennium, the Commission directed the referral of 21 candidate cases and 6 political action committee cases to the Attorney General's Office for appropriate disposition either for failure to file campaign finance reports within 30 days of the report due date or failure to pay a duly assessed penalty.

\*\*\*\*\*

<u>Complaints:</u> A person may apply in writing to the Commission requesting an investigation concerning the registration or report of a candidate, treasurer, political committee or political action committee. Each such request is acknowledged and subsequently pursued if the nature of the claim is relevant to the Commission's jurisdiction, and the reasons stated for the request show sufficient grounds for believing a violation may have occurred. A preliminary investigation may be conducted and findings made. The findings, together with a recommendation, are presented by the staff to the full Commission which then is responsible for deciding the merits of each

case. In the conduct of investigations, the Commission may subpoena witnesses and records and take evidence under oath.

<u>During 1997</u>, the Commission received 34 complaints concerning alleged violations of the various laws subject to the Commission's jurisdiction. The disposition of those cases was as follows:

Four complaints were deemed to be outside the Commission's jurisdiction. Of the remaining complaints, 17 concerned "attribution" violations. The Commission dismissed 9 of those cases either because the respondents provided remedy within 10 days of receiving notice of the violation or because the Commission found no violation of the law to have occurred, as a result of which no penalty was assessed. In 8 cases where a violation was found to have occurred and no remedy was made, the Commission assessed a penalty ranging from \$10 to \$200 depending upon the facts of each individual case. One case involving an alleged violation of political action committee registration requirements was dismissed pursuant to a finding of no violation. Additional complaints alleged violations of the campaign finance reporting requirements (7), improper use of campaign funds (2), misrepresentation in campaign literature (2), and conflict of interest (1). The State Auditor, on behalf of the Commission, conducted audits/investigations of two political action committees. The Commission accepted the recommendations of the Auditor, in one case assessing civil penalties for reporting violations, and in the other case directing remedial actions to be taken by the committee.

<u>During 1998</u>, the Commission received 15 complaints concerning alleged violations of the campaign finance laws. The disposition of these cases was as follows:

Eight complaints concerned "attribution" violations. The Commission dismissed 4 of those cases either because the respondents provided remedy within 10 days of receiving notice of the violation or because the Commission found no violation of the law to have occurred, as a result of which no penalty was assessed. In the 4 cases where a violation was found to have occurred and no remedy was made, the Commission assessed a penalty ranging from \$25 to \$100 depending upon the facts of each individual case. Two cases involving an alleged violation of political action committee registration requirements resulted in a dismissal of one and a penalty of \$50 in the other case for failure to properly register and report. Additional complaints alleged violations of the campaign finance reporting requirements (7), misrepresentation in campaign literature (3), and a violation of legislative ethics (1). The State Auditor, on behalf of the Commission, conducted an audit/investigation of a candidate's campaign committee activities, however, the Commission had not concluded consideration of that matter by year's end.

<u>Post-Election Year Filings</u>: The post-election filings of primary and general election candidates revealed that 278 candidates ended the election year with active campaign accounts. Under the law, the disposition of any surplus or deficit of more than \$50 remaining in a candidate's account must be disclosed in semiannual reports. To ensure compliance, the Commission staff notifies each candidate subject to post-election year requirements of the filing requirements. As with election year reports, filings are monitored for timeliness.

Following the election year, the staff carefully examines each election report to detect any technical errors that may have been missed earlier. When a report is found to be deficient, the candidate's treasurer is notified and asked to make corrections in the form of an amended report.

The final audit is an important step in ensuring that the figures published in the Commission's official election report are accurate. The audit of campaign finance reports during the 1998 election season resulted in the identification of errors in approximately 25% of the filed reports that required amendment. Correction notices were mailed or telephone contact made, depending upon the complexity of the error that required amendment.

Election Year Planning: Once work on the last election year season (including preparation of the annual report) has been completed, planning begins for the next election year cycle. Preparations involve updating written guidelines, instructions, and reporting forms; and compiling new filing schedules. In addition to that activity, the year 2000 election cycle presents a new challenge to Commission staff with the implementation of the new Maine Clean Election Act. That law requires the Commission to fulfill numerous specific statutory responsibilities to provide candidates running for State Senator or State Representative in 2000 the voluntary option of being certified as eligible to receive public funding of their campaigns from the Maine Clean Election Fund, a multi-million dollar source of revenue derived from Legislative appropriations, voluntary taxpayer check-offs in their income tax returns, deposit of all qualifying contributions received by participating Clean Election Act candidates, and several other sources of revenue specified in the Maine Clean Election Act. The determination of the amounts of the initial distributions for participating candidates will be made before July 1, 1999; and a Candidate's Guide to the Maine Clean Election Act will be published during the Summer of 1999.

<u>Municipal Candidates/Party Committees</u>: Prior to the start of each election year, the staff distributes revised reporting forms and instructions to state party committees and to municipal clerks in those cities and towns where candidates for public office are governed by the State campaign finance law.

#### **SPENDING SUMMARIES - 1998**


Spending summaries for the 1998 election year are shown on the following pages. Figures for each year reflect the amounts reported by candidates on their periodic campaign finance reports and have not been adjusted over time. The chart on page 10 shows that on average, a winning Senate candidate spent \$23,581.57 in 1998. The average figures reflect a return to the generally upward trend in the cost of election campaign financing. However, the median figure reflects a 1998 drop in comparison with the 1994 and 1996 median expenditures by winning Senate candidates. Based on these figures, it may be anticipated that the cost of running for election to the Maine State Senate will continue to increase in the future.

The campaign finance reports of winning candidates running for State Representative reflect a continuing trend of increasing expenditures in 1998, both in terms of average and median campaign costs compared to previous years. Consequently, it may be anticipated that the cost of being elected to the State House of Representatives will also likely continue to increase in the future.

While the total expenditures of all political action committees (PACs) (both candidate and issue PACs) decreased slightly in 1998 (\$8,275,242.70) compared to 1996 (\$8,748,797.60), the total expenditures of candidate PACs nearly doubled from \$765,776.00 in 1996 to \$1,512,036.12 in 1998, surpassing the previously highest level of candidate PAC spending of \$968,845.00 in 1990 and representing a significant shift in the financial influence of candidate PACs. Insufficient data exist to predict reliably whether that shift constitutes a trend in that source of candidate campaign financing.







#### LOBBYIST DISCLOSURE PROCEDURES

The lobbyist disclosure law requires registered lobbyists to file monthly reports with the Commission. The reports must show the compensation received and expenditures made by the lobbyists in support of their lobbying activities. Lobbyists must file annual reports as well.

Each fall, the staff reviews reporting forms and instructions and revises them as necessary to conform them to legal requirements. Packets containing registration forms and instructions for reporting are then mailed to the previous year's registrants. The staff produces and publishes an annual register containing the names and addresses of all registered lobbyists and their employers. In January of each year, the staff compiles and publishes a lobbyist compensation report summarizing the activity of lobbyists for the previous lobbyist registration year that ends November 30. Both the register and the annual report are available for public inspection and may be purchased for a small fee.

As with campaign finance reports, each monthly disclosure report is monitored for timeliness and completeness. Lobbyists filing late reports are referred to the Commission for determination of the appropriate sanction as provided by statute. While most lobbyists remit payment upon notification of the penalty amount, those who do not are referred to the Attorney General's Office for appropriate disposition and may have their lobbying privileges revoked during the pendency of that process.

#### Lobbyist Activity 1997:

The number of individual lobbyists and lobbyist employers in 1997 increase by 35% and 30%, respectively, compared to 1996, while reported expenses appeared also to increase significantly. The comparison of 1997 reported expenses with previous years, however, may not be appropriate because of changes in the 1997 reporting form requiring lobbyists to report expenses separately from compensation. Prior to 1997, it is unclear whether all lobbyists were including expenses in their compensation total. The total number of lobbyist registrations (i.e., lobbyist/employer, employer/lobbyist, recognizing that an individual lobbyist may work for more than one employer and an individual employer may employ more than one lobbyist) also increased significantly in 1997, from 292 registrations to 410, a 40% increase. The amount of compensation paid to lobbyists increased by 82% from 1996 to 1997, to a single year record of \$3,852,653.80. Between 1996 and 1997, the reported amount spent on officials by lobbyists decreased by nearly 6%, while the reported amount in excess of \$25 spent on officials increased by nearly 17%.

#### Lobbyist Activity 1998:

The number of individual lobbyists and lobbyist employers in 1998 decreased by 22% and 12%, respectively, compared to 1997, while reported expenses also decreased by nearly 32%. The total number of lobbyist registrations (i.e., lobbyist/employer, employer/lobbyist, recognizing that an individual lobbyist may work for more than one employer and an individual employer may employ more than one lobbyist) also decreased by nearly 18% in 1998, from 410 to 338 registrations. The amount of compensation paid to lobbyists decreased by nearly 39% from 1997 to 1998, the previous single year record. Between 1997 and 1998, the reported amount spent on officials by lobbyists decreased over 20%, while the reported amount in excess of \$25 spent on officials decreased by nearly 17%.

The above analysis appears to continue the general trend in lobbying activity representing a greater level of activity and commensurate expense in the first year of a legislative biennium than in the second year.

**Decade Summary:** In 1994, the Commission staff studied the numbers of lobbyists and lobbyist employers conducting business in Maine from 1987 through 1995, and the compensation received by lobbyists from 1989 to 1995. The results of that study beginning with calendar year 1989, updated to include the present reporting period, are summarized on page 51 of this report.

With respect to Part A of that summary, it should be noted that the level of activity conducted each year is directly related to the duration of the legislative session; i.e., the first Legislative session, which falls in the odd-numbered year and includes consideration of the biennial budget, produces more activity than does the shorter, second session. Hence, while the figures accurately reflect yearly activity, they are less useful in measuring progression. A better gauge would be to compare totals for the Legislative Biennium which combine activity for both the first and second sessions. That comparison is provided in Part B.

The study shows that between the 114th Legislature (1989-1990) and the 118th Legislature (1997-1998), lobbyist registrations increased over 10%, compensation paid to lobbyists increased more than 60%, and expenses increased nearly 90%. The total compensation paid to lobbyists during the 1997-98 biennium was more than in any previous biennium reported.

#### LAWS ON LEGISLATIVE ETHICS AND FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE

Unlike many state codes, Maine's legislative ethics laws do not impose sanctions as a means of resolving ethical problems. Rather, they define the standards by which Legislators are expected to abide and they admonish Legislators to avoid even the appearance of misconduct or conflict of interest. The law empowers the Commission to conduct investigations; and it further authorizes the Commission to issue opinions and recommendations. But the opinions rendered by the Commission, whether at the request of a Legislator, or on the Commission's own motion, are strictly advisory; and the ultimate responsibility for resolving ethical issues rests with the Legislature itself.

A key aspect of the legislative ethics law is personal financial disclosure. Under that law, Legislators as well as Legislative candidates are required to disclose the sources of their personal income, including any unsecured indebtedness. The purpose of such disclosure is threefold: 1) to reveal to citizens any potential conflicts of interest; 2) to remind Legislators of potential sources of conflicts of interest; and 3) to discourage Legislators from using their office for personal gain or benefit. Disclosure statements are available for public inspection.

Ethics Seminar: To promote awareness of the standards established by the Legislature, the Commission conducts a seminar for Legislators prior to the commencement of the first regular session of each Legislature. The seminar is conducted in conjunction with the Attorney General's office and the Executive Director of the Legislative Council. Participants usually include the Speaker of the House, the President of the Senate, the Attorney General, the Chairman of the Ethics Commission, and the Executive Director of the Ethics Commission.

1997-98 Activity: A complaint involving a potential conflict of interest was dismissed by the Commission on the basis that the complaint did not state a valid claim. Another complaint alleging the improper use by two Legislators of their Legislative positions by the inappropriate use of Legislative stationery also was dismissed. However, the Commission noted its concern about the potential appearance of the imposition of the Legislative offices in that case in an otherwise private matter. The Commission issued 13 informal advisory opinions at the request of individual Legislators; 3 at the request of lobbyists; 1 at the request of a political action committee; and 1 at the request of the Commission staff.

The Commission approved a Policy Statement regarding the cancellation of a joint lobbyist registration and the requirements for refund or return of the lobbyist registration fee. A copy of that policy statement is enclosed at page 123.

#### INFORMAL ADVISORY OPINIONS

During 1997-98, the Commission issued the following <u>informal</u> advisory opinions in response to the inquiries of Legislators, lobbyists, political action committees, and others. A word of caution about the general use of these opinions: While the Commission's objective in printing these opinions is to increase Legislator and public understanding of and sensitivity to the laws administered by the Commission, only persons who receive an advisory opinion from the Commission may rely on that opinion as protection against an adverse Commission finding if a complaint is filed against another individual. Each case is decided based on its own unique facts.

#### **Issues Concerning Conflicts of Interest**

ISSUE: Representation by Legislator before State agency.

OPINION: There is no conflict of interest in a Legislator's representation of a business or a citizen before a State agency since the services would be provided in the Legislator's professional capacity rather than in a legislative capacity. See 1 MRSA section 1014(2).

ISSUE: Effect of private employment on vote on legislation.

OPINION: There is no conflict of interest to vote on turnpike-related bills if employed by the Maine Turnpike Authority. However, sitting as a member of the legislative committee with oversight jurisdiction over or appropriation authority regarding the MTA creates the possible appearance of a conflict of interest on bills regarding the salaries or benefits of intermediate part-time employees of the MTA. Therefore, Legislators are advised to recuse themselves on any matter that might create the appearance of a conflict of interest.

ISSUE: Acceptance of services.

OPINION: Whether the acceptance of free Internet services would violate the Maine Ethics Laws or any other state law is governed by the provisions of 1 MRSA section 1014(1)(B) (the ethics provision) and 17-A MRSA section 605 (the criminal law provision). A violation of the first provision would occur if the value of the services from a single source exceeded \$300 per year; but, the second provision could be violated regardless of the value of the services. In this case, the requester acknowledged that the "services might be useful in examining Internet and telecommunications issues expected to come before the Legislature" and, therefore, would constitute an "interest by a prospective donor in a matter before the Legislature." Acceptance of those services would constitute a possible violation of the criminal law provision which is subject to the jurisdiction of the Attorney General's Office.

ISSUE: Voting on Internet and telecommunications issues.

OPINION: It is not a conflict of interest to vote on Internet and telecommunications issues if employed by a non-regulated telecommunications company that sometimes competes with utilities that are regulated by the Legislature because the benefit to the Legislator is not unique and distinct from that received by members of the general public who are similarly engaged.

ISSUE: Employment conflict with position as Legislator.

OPINION: It is not a conflict of interest for a Legislator to hold a paid party position as the executive director of a political party in the State while also serving in the Legislature.

ISSUE: Voting on particular bill.

OPINION: It is not a conflict of interest for a Legislator to vote on a particular bill that would grant authority to a legislative oversight committee to review appointments of the Commissioner of Public Safety and the Chief of Police. The Legislator is employed by an organization that was issued a contract by the Department of Public Safety.

ISSUE: Employment question.

OPINION: Generally, there is no conflict of interest or legal bar to employment as an "on-call toll collector" for the Maine Turnpike Authority while serving in the Legislature. However, specific conflict of interest issues may arise regarding which the Legislator would be prudent to refer to the Ethics Commission for a specific determination.

ISSUE: Employment question.

OPINION: Based on the specific, unique facts of the instant case, no conflict of interest was found to exist under the circumstances in which a Legislator, as the President of a company, entered into a contract to provide services to the State. See 1 MRSA 1014(3)(A).

ISSUE: Employment question.

OPINION: No conflict of interest arises by a Legislator's representation of a client before a State agency in that Legislator's professional capacity as an attorney.

#### **Issues Concerning Campaign Finance**

ISSUE: Raising campaign funds.

OPINION: There is no legal bar to raising campaign funds by selling advertising space on a personal web site on the Internet, where prospective vendors (including corporations, groups, and various organizations) are fully informed of the purpose for which the funds will be used, provided the candidate meets all applicable record keeping and reporting requirements, complies with campaign contribution limitations, and does not solicit or accept funds from impermissible sources during the legislative session.

ISSUE: Reporting requirements of political action committee.

OPINION: A political action committee formed to advocate positions on multiple issues may not file a consolidated report covering receipts and expenditures for all issues, but instead must file a separate registration and reports for each issue to ensure full disclosure involving each issue.

ISSUE: Contributions by lobbyists during the legislative session.

OPINION: Contributions to Legislators by an employee of a lobbyist employer are permissible. Contributions by an employee of a registered lobbyist are permissible. However, contributions by a "principal officer" of a lobbyist's or lobbyist employer's legal organization (i.e. corporation, etc.) are not permissible. In the first two instances, the contributions must actually be from the stated source and not in any form of otherwise impermissible "agency" capacity.

ISSUE: Candidate registration requirements.

OPINION: A person becomes a "candidate" for Ethics Commission registration and reporting requirements when that person "has received contributions or made expenditures or has given consent for any other person to receive contributions or make expenditures with the intent of qualifying as a candidate." See 21-A MRSA section 1(5). A person must register with the Ethics Commission no later than 10 days after becoming a "candidate" and before accepting contributions, making expenditures or incurring obligations. See 21-A MRSA section 1013-A(1)(A). A "candidate" who fails to register with the Commission within the time allowed may be assessed a forfeiture of \$10. See 21-A MRSA section 1020-A(1).

#### **Issue Concerning Lobbyist Disclosure**

ISSUE: Association newsletters to Legislators.

OPINION: Sending association newsletters to Legislators is considered "lobbying" within the definition found at 3 MRSA section 312-A(9) and, therefore, must be reported as lobbying activity by 3 MRSA section 317(1)(E) if the intent of the information contained in the communication is to influence legislative action.

ISSUE: Lobbyist offer of meal to Legislator.

OPINION: Whether it is permissible for a lobbyist to pay for a legislator's dinner, where the two are personal friends, the function is strictly social, and no legislation will be discussed is dependent upon the intent of the lobbyist to influence any legislation presently or prospectively before the Legislature or to reward for any action taken by the legislator on previous legislation. It is immaterial whether the meal is provided in a private home or a restaurant.

ISSUE: Gifts of transportation and accommodations to Legislators.

OPINION; A lobbyist employer may provide transportation, accommodations and meals to legislators for informational tours of the employer's facilities provided the total value is less than \$300 from a single source per legislator per year. However, legislators are advised to contact the Attorney General's office regarding the interpretation of the provisions of 17-A MRSA section 605 regarding the acceptance of anything of "pecuniary benefit" by public servants.

#### **Issue Concerning Sources of Income**

ISSUE: "Significant others" as source of income.

OPINION: State law does not require the reporting of the disclosure of a Legislator's income or liabilities derived from a "significant other" who may be making partial payments of household expenses, etc. See 1 MRSA sections 1016-A and 1016-B.

ISSUE: Corporation as employer of Legislator.

OPINION: Where the business of the Legislator is incorporated, and where the Legislator is the sole officer of that corporation, the Legislator is considered "employed by another" (i.e., the corporation) and not "self-employed" for the purpose of reporting sources of income as required by 1 MRSA section 1016-A.

#### COMMISSION POLICY STATEMENT

#### Cancellation of a Joint Lobbyist Registration; Refund/Return of Registration Fee

A joint lobbyist registration filed pursuant to the provisions of 3 M.R.S.A. Section 313 may be canceled and the accompanying registration fee refunded (or returned if the check has not been cashed) only if the following conditions are met:

- 1) Both the person named as the lobbyist and the person named as the employer (hereinafter known as "registrants") on the registration form request in a letter to the Commission that the registration be canceled and the fees be refunded; and that the letter specify the reason for the request.
- 2) The letter of request is received by the Commission staff within five business days of the date of receipt of stamped on the registration form.
- 3) The reason stated for the request is deemed by the Commission staff to be a valid one.
- 4) The letter of request contains a sworn statement that no lobbying was conducted by the lobbyist or the lobbyist associate(s), if any, on behalf of the employer shown on the registration with respect to that particular registration.
- 5) The petitioner submits a check in the amount of \$25 to cover administrative costs; or, if the check accompanying the registration fee has been processed, the petitioner grants permission for administrative costs to be deducted from the refund.

NOTE: Registration fees will be refunded or returned to the signatory on the check accompanying the registration unless the registrants specify jointly that the refund is to be allocated otherwise.



#### **LEGISLATION**

Initiated Bill 5 (Legislative Document No. 1823), An Act to Reform Campaign Finance, was approved by the voters of the State of Maine at the election held on November 5, 1996, and took effect on January 2, 1997, pursuant to M. R. S. A. Const., Art. 4, Pt. 3, § 19.

The Initiated Bill amended existing law and added new provisions, including new Chapter 14 of Title 21-A, The Maine Clean Election Act that established an alternative campaign financing option available to candidates running for Governor, State Senator and State Representative. The alternative campaign financing option is available to candidates for elections to be held beginning in the year 2000. The Commission is responsible for administering the Act the and Maine Clean Election Fund established by the Act. Candidates participating in the Maine Clean Election Act must also comply with all other applicable election and campaign laws and regulations. The Commission adopted rules to implement the Maine Clean Election Act that became effective on November 1, 1998, after an extensive public rulemaking process pursuant to the requirements of the Maine Administrative Procedures Act.

The following actions were taken by the 118th Legislature that affected the Commission:

#### **Governmental Ethics**

- Amended 1 M.R.S.A. § 1005 by reducing the number of commission members necessary to conduct public meetings from 6 to 3 to reflect the previously reduced size of the commission to a total of 5 members.
- Added new 1 M.R.S.A. § 1015, sub-§ 3, to prohibit certain campaign contributions and solicitations of campaign contributions during a legislative session.

#### Campaign Finance

- Amended 21-A M.R.S.A. § 1052, sub-§ 4, to redefine what is included and not included in the term "expenditure" for the purpose of campaign finance disclosure by political action committees.
- Amended 21-A M.R.S.A. § 1055, to address the requirements for a person operating a broadcasting station regarding expenditures for political communications by political action committees.
- Amended 21-A M.R.S.A. § 1058 regarding the qualifications for filing reports by political action committees.

#### ASSISTANCE TO THE COMMISSION

The Attorney General's Office designates an Assistant Attorney General to function as Commission Counsel and to provide advice at Commission meetings. The Secretary of State's Office maintains the Commission's budget, financial, and payroll records. The State Auditor assists the staff in preparing statistics and in conducting report audits. The support provided by each of those agencies enables the Commission staff to perform its primary duties more efficiently.
