Brook trout (squaretail)

Physical Characteristics

Area - 66 acres

Jerry Pond and the area surrounding it is being developed as a recreational area for the people of Millinocket under the joint effort of the local Kiwanis and Fin and Feather Clubs. A good access road was built by the Kiwanis, with the help of the Great Northern Paper Company. A picnic area is present and a man-made sand beach will provide excellent swimming facilities. A boat launching site will be established adjacent to the sand beach.

Jerry Pond was treated with rotenone in September, 1960 to eradicate the entire fish population. Brook trout can provide good fishing when rough fish are eliminated and do not compete with trout for food and space. Legal-sized brook trout will be stocked in the spring of 1961 and then fingerling trout will be stocked annually.

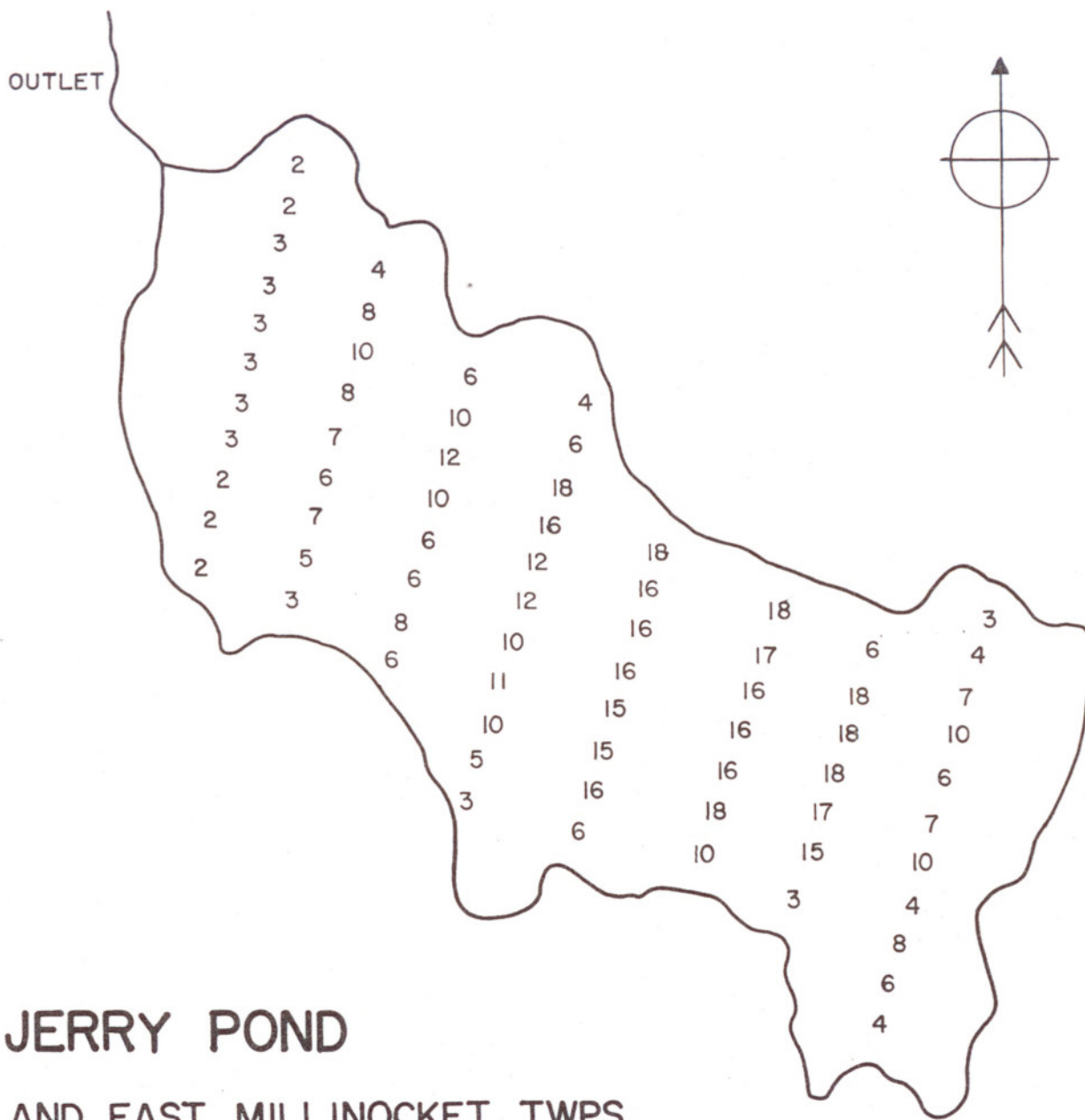
A barrier dam was constructed on the outlet stream by the Fin and Feather Club. This will prevent unwanted fish from migrating up the outlet to the pond and becoming re-established.

The following regulations have been established to help prevent the reintroduction of undesirable fish and distribute the catch among a large number of fishermen.

1. A five trout daily bag limit.
2. The use or possession of live fish as bait prohibited.
3. Closure to ice fishing.
