SUBJ: Revenues - May

May General Fund revenues were over budget by $\$ 21.5$ million or $9.4 \%$. With one month remaining in FY13, General Fund revenues are $\$ 18.3$ million over budget ( $+0.7 \%$ ). Compared to the same eleven month period last fiscal year, revenues are up $2.1 \%$ ( $\$ 52.8$ million). Please note that the May Controller's Report reflects the new revenue forecast adopted by the Revenue Forecasting Committee on May $1^{\text {st }}$.

Sales and use tax receipts showed moderate growth in May, increasing $3.8 \%$ over the same month last year; $\$ 1.3$ million over budget. April taxable sales (May revenue) were up 5\%, with building supply stores and auto/transportation establishments increasing by $12.3 \%$ and $9.2 \%$, respectively. For the calendar year taxable sales are only up $1.3 \%$. The strength in monthly sales may be a timing issue with consumers making outdoor and gardening purchases later this spring, or it may represent a stabilization of consumer sentiment after a difficult start to the year.

May individual income tax receipts were over budget by $\$ 15.6$ million. Withholding was over budget by $\$ 10.3$ million. The surplus on withholding may be associated with a stronger than projected quarterly payment. Final payments were $\$ 3$ million over for the month and refunds were $\$ 1.9$ million under for the month. Strong final payments and weak refunds likely reflect stronger than budgeted 2012 liability.

## Sales \& Use Taxes

Revenue was $\$ 1.3$ million over budget for the month and $\$ 925,757$ (-0.1\%) under budget fiscal year-to-date. Fiscal year-to-date revenue was \$790,434 (-0.1\%) under fiscal year 2012.

## Taxable Sales

Total taxable sales for the month of April (May revenue) were up 5.0\% from April 2012. The annual rate of change was $1.6 \%$. Building supply sales were up $12.3 \%$ for the month and down 4.8\% for the year ending in April. Sales of taxable items in food stores were flat for the month and up $2.2 \%$ for the year. General merchandise sales (primarily sales of goods sold in large department and discount stores) were down $3.4 \%$ for the month and up $0.5 \%$ for the year. Sales in other retail stores such as jewelry, drug, sporting goods, book, antique, pet, photo, toy, and craft stores were up $2.1 \%$ for the month and $0.1 \%$ for the year. Auto/transportation sector sales were up $9.2 \%$ for the month and $4.1 \%$ for the year. Sales of meals and other prepared foods were up $2.6 \%$ for the month and $4.0 \%$ for the year. Lodging sales were up $4.9 \%$ for the month and $7.3 \%$ for the year. Business operating sales (primarily use tax paid by businesses) were up $9.8 \%$ for the month and $1.9 \%$ for the year.

## Service Provider Tax

Revenue was $\$ 681,084$ over budget for the month and $\$ 1.5$ million (+3.8\%) over budget fiscal year-to-date.

## Individual Income Tax

Revenue was $\$ 15.6$ million over budget for the month and $\$ 18.8$ million ( $+1.4 \%$ ) over budget fiscal year-to-date. Fiscal year-to-date withholding payments were 0.1\% under fiscal year 2012. Estimated payments were up $18.2 \%$ and final payments were up $29.3 \%$ fiscal year-to-date. Fiscal year-to-date revenue was \$92.3 million (+7.4\%) over fiscal year 2012.

## Corporate Income Tax

Revenue was $\$ 1.5$ million under budget for the month and $\$ 1.7$ million ( $-1.2 \%$ ) under budget fiscal year-to-date. Estimated payments were down $13.6 \%$ and final payments were down 30.8\% fiscal year-to-date. Fiscal year-to-date revenue was $\$ 54.4$ million (-28.5\%) under fiscal year 2012.

## Cigarette \& Tobacco Taxes

Cigarette and tobacco products tax revenue was $\$ 1.6$ million over budget for the month and $\$ 1.4$ million ( $+1.2 \%$ ) over budget fiscal year-to-date.

## Insurance Companies Taxes

The Insurance Companies Taxes were \$527,929 under budget for the month and $\$ 1$ million under budget fiscal year-to-date.

## Estate Tax

The estate tax was $\$ 1.7$ million over budget for the month and $\$ 1.2$ million under budget fiscal year-to-date.

## Transfers for Tax Relief Programs

Refunds for the tax \& rent, Business Equipment Tax Reimbursement (BETR) and Business Equipment Tax Exemption (BETE) were over budget in May by $\$ 0.297$ million, and are now $\$ 0.250$ million under budget for the fiscal year.

## Municipal Revenue Sharing

Revenue sharing was over budget for the month by $\$ 0.108$ million. Year-to-date revenue sharing is over budget by approximately $\$ 0.585$ million.

## Lottery

Lottery Revenues were over budget for the month by $\$ 1.4$ million or $34.4 \%$. For the first eleven months of the fiscal year lottery receipts are over budget by $\$ 1.5$ million.

## Other Revenues

Other Revenues were under budget by $\$ 0.7$ million for the month, a variance of $-15.9 \%$. For the fiscal year other revenues are $\$ 0.5$ million over budget.

## Highway Fund

Motor fuel tax receipts were under budget in May by $\$ 0.8$ million. The Highway Fund as a whole was also over budget for the month by $\$ 0.4$ million. Fiscal year-to-date motor fuel excise taxes are on budget and the total Highway Fund is over budget by $\$ 2.7$ million ( $+1.0 \%$ ).

## National Economy

The Federal Reserve's Federal Open Market Committee (FOMC) meets this week to review economic conditions since they last met on May $1^{\text {st }}$. The economy continues to grow at a $2 \%$ pace, well below the rate necessary for significant ground to be made in reducing the unemployment rate. The FOMC will review reports that will show that consumers are starting to adjust to the higher federal taxes enacted at the start of 2013 and lower energy prices that have been relatively stable in recent months. At the same time a string of reports on manufacturing activity show that future activity may be weaker as the sequestration and the recession in Europe slow demand for their output. In addition, manufacturers appear to be cutting back on their spending for capital goods.

## Maine Economy

The April taxable sales report was the best in a number of months. With the exception of general merchandise stores ( $-3.4 \%$ year-over-year), consumer sales rebounded in April. The late arrival of spring weather likely consolidated gardening and other outdoor purchases in April. The Maine data matched up well with national reports on April retail sales. Very preliminary data suggests that May sales may have been solid as well. We'll need to see a solid quarter of similar growth before concluding that Maine consumers are confident again about the economy.
