**SUSPENSION OF LICENSE**

On July 17, 2014, the Board of Osteopathic Licensure (“the Board”) issued a Decision and Order (“Decision and Order”) in the matter of CR 2013-30 after holding an adjudicatory hearing on July 10, 2014. In the Decision and Order, the Board found violations and imposed consecutive 90 day license suspensions for a period of 450 days. The Board stayed 360 days of the license suspension subject to Dr. Gosselin’s successful completion of conditions of probation for a period of five years, including participation in the Maine Physician’s Health Program (“MPHP”), and conditioned upon his compliance with the terms of the probation, including his participation in a treatment plan.

On August 10, 2017, the Board considered information received from the MPHP regarding several violations of Dr. Gosselin’s monitoring agreement with the MPHP during the period of April 2016 through July 2017, Dr. Gosselin’s admissions regarding the violations, and voted to lift the stay of license suspension and impose a license suspension for the remaining 360 days as authorized in the Decision and Order. Therefore, the Board ORDERED THE IMMEDIATE SUSPENSION OF THE LICENSE OF DR. GOSSELIN TO PRACTICE OSTEOPATHIC MEDICINE in the State of Maine for a period of 360 days in accordance with the July 17, 2014 Decision and Order. All other terms and requirements of the Decision and Order remain in full force and effect.

Dr. GOSSELIN must immediately cease practicing osteopathic medicine and arrange for the care of patients by another medical provider. Dr. GOSSELIN is not authorized to act as supervising physician for any physician extender.
