Re: Rural Medical Access Program (RMAP) Assessment Rate

The RMAP was created to promote prenatal services in underserved areas of the state by proving medical malpractice insurance premium assistance for medical professionals who provide prenatal care in designated areas if the State. Title 24-A M.R.S. §6302 requires every physician (practicing in Maine), hospital, and physician's employer to participate in the RMAP. Assessments are collected from Maine practicing physicians, hospitals, and physician's employers to fund the RMAP.

In accordance with 02-031 CMR ch. 630, the Acting Superintendent set the assessment rate of 0.5% for the July 1, 2022- June 30, 2023 RMAP Assessment year. It has been determined the rate will change to 0.4% for the July 1, 2023 – June 30, 2024 RMAP year.
