• Is driven

- A motor vehicle with permanently mounted equipment not designed or used primarily for the transportation of persons or property.
- Includes, but is not limited to, road construction or maintenance machinery, or similar types of equipment.

Special Mobile Equipment

Class Code: TR



Definition

- Special Mobile Equipment is not designed, to carry a load.
 - Example: a *Grader* is designed to move material.
- Commercial vehicles are designed to be able to take a load.
 - Example: a *Dump Truck* which hauls gravel to a site.










• Is towed.

- Not designed or used to convey property other than hand tools or parts used in connection with the operation of that equipment.
- Includes, but is not limited to, air compressors, conveyors, cement mixers, wood splitting or sawing machines, sprayers, compactors, pumps, drills and brush chippers.

Special Equipment

Definition

Class Code: SE



- Special Equipment is not designed to carry a **load.**
 - Example: a Splitter is designed to split logs, not carry them down the road.
- Trailers are designed to be able to take a load.
 - Example: a *Boom Trailer* places objects on the trailer to be towed.

Special Equipment





- A street sweeper designed to pick up or sweep dirt and has a water tank is registered as Class A.
- A street sweeper without a water tank is designed to push dirt and registered as Class B.
- A food concession trailer is registered as Special Equipment
