

Winter Camping

at Maine State Parks and Public Lands



At select Maine State Parks from December 15—March 15.

Primitive Tent Camping Only:



- No water, amenities, or cleared campsites or trails.
- Campsites accessed by snowshoe or skis, some walk-in (see list below).
- Camp only at designated sites; 7-day limit of stay.
- Fires only allowed at designated fire pits; Maine local wood only—Protect ME forests & parks from harm— [Buy It Where You Burn It!](#)
- On-site self-registration required.
- Camping fees* apply—payable by cash or check at self registration.
 - * The \$50 Registration Fee is waived.

Fees: [Camping](#) for 1-6 people; follows standard fee schedule.

[Group Camping](#) for 7-10 people = \$54.50/night.

• \$5.45 per person/night for each additional camper beyond 10 (including children).

- **Primitive Camping Only:** No amenities or plowed locations; winter camping experience and self-sufficiency a must. Parking is not allowed on plowed road shoulders.
